#### **TRAININGS**

"Something for Everyone" was the unofficial training mantra in 2013-14 as FRIS coordinated/ presented 45 trainings in the targeted areas detailed below.

#### **Children and Youth**

The WV Sexual Violence Training and Prevention Resource Toolkit for School-Aged Children and Youth was piloted in four counties with targeted groups:

- Clay school personnel
- Greenbrier—community preventionists
- Monongalia—school personnel
- Wood—community preventionists

#### **College Campuses**

Topics and presenters included:

- Title IX; Office for Civil Rights
- The WV Prevention and Interpersonal Violence Intervention Training Toolkit (PIVIT): Prevention Edition launch featured trainer Dorothy Edwards on designing effective prevention programs
- Bystander Intervention by FRIS staff for Davis & Elkins College resident assistants

#### **People With Disabilities**

A collaboration with the Northern WV Center for Independent Living (NWVCIL), WV Division of Rehabilitation Services, WV Statewide Independent Living Council and Fair Shake Network resulted in a two-day training for disability service providers in the state, where the WV S.A.F.E. intervention toolkit was reviewed and distributed for the first time with that target population.

Two SART trainings were dedicated to serving victim with disabilities, with trainings also held in two counties and with one disability service provider:

- SART 101 Training at Concord College
- "Why a Penny Matters"—a financial training with the rape crisis centers



#### **WEST VIRGINIA GOES SANE**

2013-14 was the year for SANE (Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners), as several multi-year SANE projects culminated:

- A 24-hour on-line SANE course was developed and launched in late June, enabling free access to training for nurses interested in becoming SANEs.
- A faculty of 8 nurses was trained to provide the 16hour classroom component of the 40-hour SANE training. The nurses, geographically dispersed throughout the state, each received a training resource kit to facilitate regional trainings and increase access to this portion of the training.
- The legislature passed a bill creating a state-level SANE Commission. The Commission will be working to create a standard of care for forensic exams and require every county to have a protocol for exams.

#### **VISIONARY VOICE AWARD RECIPIENT**

FRIS' selection for the 2014 Visionary Voice Award was Marshall University Forensic Science Center (MUFSC). Since 2003, MUFSC has partnered with FRIS on numerous projects, including sponsoring semi-annual SANE trainings for many years when no other funds were available to conduct the trainings; creating, hosting and supporting FRIS' website so that information on sexual violence is readily available; and creating a sex crime kit tracking application that is currently being used by the WV State Police Crime Lab. An ambitious project that was launched in June 2014 was the creation of a 24 hour, online SANE course as part of the online Sexual Assault Services Training Academy (SASTA), which is a partnership of MUFSC, FRIS, and West Virginia University. The inkind support provided by MUFSC has enabled West Virginia to better train first responders to sexual assault through innovative, accessible training resources and ultimately improve services for victims in the state.


